KIEP has an affiliate in Beijing, and also works in partnership with the Korea Economic Institute of America (KEI) located in Washington D.C. KIEP also operates National Center for APEC Studies from our institute.

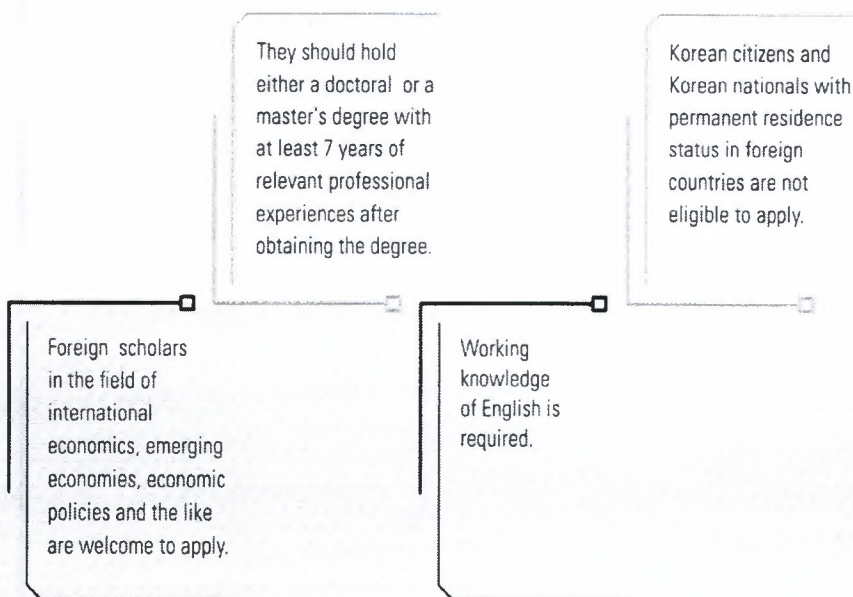
## About the Program

- ① conduct an independent research and produce a report on the research findings in the form of KIEP World Economy Brief. [\[read more\]](#)

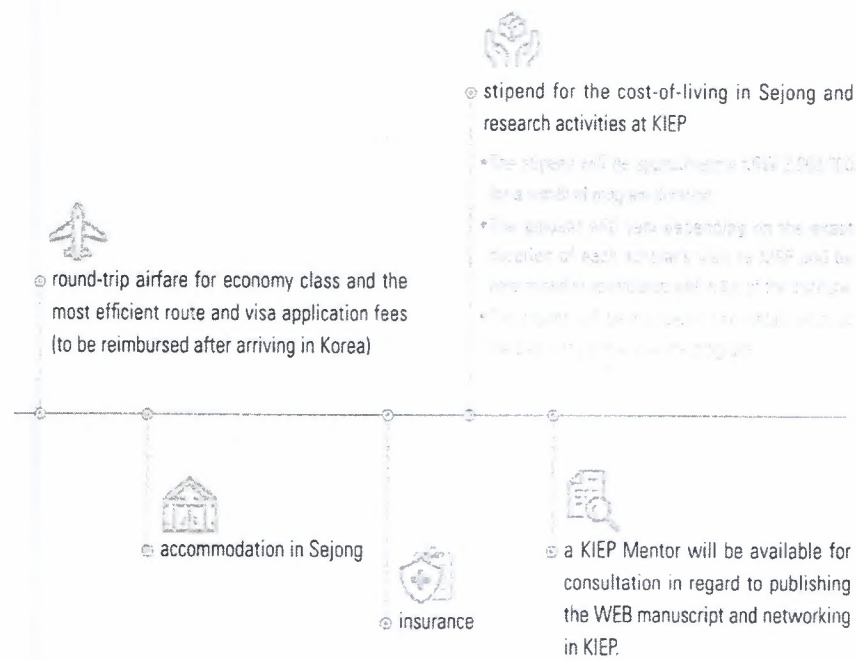
